## FIRST SESSIONAL ADDRESS BY SAM PYNE.

Hon. Samuel Pyne has delivered his first sessional address to the General Assembly as required by the Local Governance Act, 2016.

The Metro Chief Executive of the Kumasi Metropolitan Assembly (KMA), Hon. Samuel Pyne delivered his maiden sessional address at the 1st Ordinary Meeting of the 3rd Session of the 8th Kumasi Metropolitan Assembly held on Tuesday June 14, 2022 at the Prempeh Assembly hall.

Section 28 (1) and (2) (a) of the Local Governance Act, 2016 (Act 936) requires that, every Chief Executive, address the Assembly at the beginning of each session on the programmes and policies determined by

the President and also present a report on the performance of the Metropolitan Authority, his office and that of the state of the metropolis at large.

According to the MCE, the report was on the projects and programmes as well as key activities carried out in pursuance of the Assembly's vision to create an enabling environment and also to provide essential services for a good quality of life for the people of Kumasi.

### KMA Partners with World Bank.

KMA in partnership with the World Bank, Institute for Transportation and Development Policy (ITDP), and Rebel Group, is developing a road-map for the planning and implementation of a high-quality bus rapid transit (BRT) system in Kumasi, along with complementary pedestrian and cycle facilities.



BRT is a high-quality bus-based public transport system delivering fast, comfortable, and cost-effective mobility through the provision of segregated right-of-way infrastructure, rapid and frequent operations, excellence in marketing and customer service.

# WASTE MANAGEMENT RECEIVES COMPARTOR TRUCK

**H**on. It is worth noting that since road safety does not have boundaries, the city has put in place a system where all Assemblies within Greater Kumasi Metropolitan Area are involved in the education programs.

KMA is planting 700 trees from three species namely Teak, Royal Palm and Mahogany.

## Global Road Safety partnership visits Kumasi

The GRSP Team of Bloomberg Initiative for Global Road Safety (BIGRS) recently paid a two-day working visit to Kumasi.

The visit was to familiarize and ascertain the level of implementation since the initiative commenced mid-2020.

The team on the first day met with the mayor of Kumasi, Hon. Sam Pyne and other key stakeholders such as the Ghana Police Service and embedded staff.

On day two, the team conducted the crash data analysis training with the police MTTD, as well as a practical police enforcement training on selected roads.

The practical training was also used to take the police using the new speed measuring devices that was recently donated to the MTTD.

## Metro Guard-Taskforce to assist Urban Transport Department

The mayor in the person of Hon. Samuel Pyne has inaugurated a 10 member Task Force of Metro Guards to assist the Urban Transport Dept. This is in the wake of some drivers parking and loading at unauthorized places and others abusing the slot given to them. Again, the task force will also clamp down on all heavy trucks and shop owners who offload goods in the CBD after 9 am. The team was advised to report any abstraction and recalcitrant person to the police. The sole aim of the exercise is to sanitise the city, allow for free flow of traffic and easy pedestrian movement as stated by the mayor.

## Ghana Health Service and World Health Organization consults Mayor

A team from the Ghana Health Service (GHS) together with its partners from the World Health Organization (WHO) have conferred on the Kumasi Metro Chief Executive, Hon. Samuel Pyne at his office on Thursday, June 9, 2022.

The leader of the team, Dr. Carl Stephen A. Osei, National Programme Manager, Occupational and Environmental Health Unit in his speech said the team on behalf of the WHO, came to pay a courtesy call on the Mayor and to officially invite him to grace the occasion of a training workshop on Air Pollution and its effects on human health for doctors and other health professional in Kumasi.

According to him, the GHS has collaborated with the WHO to 'TRAIN HEALTH OFFICIALS' not only in the Metropolis but by extension the entire country for people to better appreciate their role as health practitioners and also bring to bear its real effects and mortalities recorded so far.

The Mayor, Hon. Samuel Pyne, welcomed them to the city of Kumasi and under scored the need for such training and the threat it poses on the masses. "It is against this backdrop, that the governments over the years have tried to minimize air pollution

through conscious efforts and have realized the need to green Ghana by the Akufo Addo led administration",



he said.

Mr. Pyne asked them to always interact and collaborate with the administration to help sensitize the public on such issues and pledge his support to send officers from KMA to also acquire some knowledge the next time the need arise.



## KSTU visits Mayor

A 4-member delegation from the Kumasi Technical University (KsTU) called on the Kumasi Mayor, Hon. Samuel Pyne.

This was to officially pay courtesy on the mayor and to congratulate him on his appointment as the new Chief Executive of KMA.

The Vice Chancellor of the University, Ing. Prof. Nana Owusu Achiaw was accompanied by three other management members of the only public university under the jurisdiction of KMA.

The Mayor, welcomed the team and assured them of the Assembly's readiness to deepen the relationship between the two institutions in all aspects of development.

The KsTU has expressed their interest to collaborate with the Assembly on expertise such as energy and sanitation among others and asked the KMA to throw in the challenge for them to solve in order to help build the city to greater heights.
